A BRIEF PROFILE

DAV College, Hoshiarpur was accredited by NAAC under RAF in August 2021 in the third cycle. It has, over the decades, carved a niche for itself in the fields of Academics, Sports and Extra Curricular activities. Established in 1926, the college is affiliated to Panjab University, Chandigarh. It imparts education in the following courses - B.A., B.B.A., B. Com., B. Com. (Hons.), B.C.A., B.Sc. (Medical, Non-Medical and Computer Science), B.Sc. (Agriculture), M. Com., M.Sc. (IT), M.A. (Punjabi, Political Science and History) besides Post Graduate Diploma in Computer Application and Post Graduate Diploma in Fashion Designing. Many skill development courses affiliated to Jagat Guru Nanak Dev Punjab State Open University, Patiala have been initiated. The excellent infrastructure- Hem Raj Kapoor Auditorium, Principal Major Raj Kumar Memorial Block, Audio- Visual Lab, ICT-enabled Commerce Block, Principal S.P. Salik Memorial Block, Principal Ramdas Hall, commodious classrooms, Lecture Theatres, well- equipped Laboratories, and well-stocked Library, Playgrounds, Gymnasium, Students' Centre, Fine Arts' Studio, Home Science Lab, Post Graduate Block, Post Graduate Library, Computer Labs, Botanical Garden, Heritage Room and a branch of Indian Bank - all provide an atmosphere that is both healthy and conducive to learning. College website www.davchsp.org.in is updated on regular basis and all information regarding teaching departments, academic calendar, infrastructure and courses is available online.

Initially set up as a High School in 1898, D.A.V. College was licked into shape by great men like late Lala Ram Parshad, Lala Devi Chand, Lala Ram Dass and Pandit Rala Ram in 1926. In response to persistent public demand, it was raised to a Degree College in 1940 and Post-graduate classes were added to the institution in 1948. The college has produced scores of scholars, administrators, professionals and statesmen who are today serving the country in various capacities. Every year our students earn positions in academics, sports and extra mural activities because of the untiring efforts of the teaching faculty. The well-qualified, experienced and dedicated faculty is continuously engaged in updating their knowledge by consistent participation in Webinars/Seminars/ Conferences and contribution to Research Journals. Several teachers are actively pursuing Research in their respective fields to upgrade their qualification. To substantiate traditional teaching with modern techniques, extensive use of ICT is made during 'Teaching with Technology Fortnight!'. Online teaching was undertaken by teachers during Lockdown period resulting from pandemic Covid-19; besides several online competitions were organised to keep the students constructively engaged during the lockdown period.

D.A.V. College aims at infusing into its alumni the spirit of selfless service through the building- up of sterling characters. It tries its best to inculcate patriotism and national culture. Education here is a harmonious blend of old and new values of life. The college functions under the supervision and control of D.A.V. College Managing Committee, which is presided over by Dr. Anoop Kumar as President and Sh. D.L. Anand as Secretary.

Infrastructure & Facilities

Administrative Block

A fully computerized administrative Block comprising of Principal's Office, General Office and Accounts Office is housed in an imposing building. The block has been renovated recently and has ultra-modern facilities. Close Circuit Television has also been installed in all parts of the college building. The office ensures smooth functioning and proper interaction with Panjab University, Chandigarh and office of the DPI (Colleges), Punjab for receiving grants, students' registration and examination etc.

Principal Major Rajkumar Memorial Block

A newly constructed block housing classrooms and office of D.A.V. Collegiate Senior Secondary School was named as Principal Major Rajkumar Memorial Block to commemorate the memory of a former Principal of the college. This block, having modern amenities, has fifteen classrooms, an Audio-Visual Room and a mini Auditorium.

Sh. Hemraj Kapoor Memorial Auditorium

Sh. Hemraj Kapoor Memorial Auditorium with a seating capacity of about eight hundred people hosts Seminars, Extension Lectures, Quiz Contests and Inter-College Competitions besides organizing Talent Search Competition. Sound-proofing of the Auditorium was undertaken to improve acoustic effects.

Principal S.P. Salik Memorial Arts' Block

Principal S.P. Salik Memorial Arts' Block, houses the offices of UGC-NRC Cell, Internal Quality Assurance Cell, Departments of Fashion Designing, Fine Arts and Music (Vocal and Instrumental).



Principal Ram Dass Hall

Named after the founder Principal of the college, Principal Ram Dass Multi- purpose Hall has been built to keep up with the determination to provide better facilities to the students. This Hall is used for various activities during the course of the session

Lab for Communicative English

A new state-of-the-art Audio-Visual Lab for Communicative English has been set up. This enables teachers as well as students to make use of latest in ICT for making learning interactive. The lab, fully air-conditioned, is equipped with interactive board & sound system. English Learning Software is used for teaching the nuances of English language. This has been set up in accordance with skill-development initiative in order to provide better opportunities for honing communicative skills.

Placement Cell

A proactive Placement Cell functions in the college with a view to provide Placement opportunities to students. Orientation sessions were organized wherein students were introduced to the process of placement and how to go about it. MoUs were signed with two organizations for training students and assisting them in the process of placement. Seminars were arranged to initiate students into the placement opportunities available in Armed forces. To instil confidence in the students and sensitize them towards issues of contemporary relevance, they were taken to G- 20 Exhibition at Amritsar. Besides, 28 students were placed in ICICI Bank and WD, Hoshiarpur in Campus Placements Drives organized by the institution.



Heritage Room

With a view to acquaint our students with the rich culture and heritage of Punjab, Heritage Room, displaying the art & artefacts, music, dance and martial arts, was set up in the college. They are further encouraged to participate in various categories of items in Youth and Heritage Festival, wherein they make the institution proud.

Library and Reading Room

The college provides excellent library and reading room facilities to the students. There are around 49,000 valuable books in the college library. Besides, over 40 Indian and Foreign Magazines, Journals and News-papers are subscribed to. The college library is fully computerized. The college is a member of N-list programme of UGC through which members can have an access to thousands of books and journals online. The library subscribes to INFLIBNET and DEL NET programmes. Students as well as teachers have access to a large number of e-books and journals. Library Orientation Programme is an integral part of education in the college, whereby students are familiarized with the functioning of the library. A Book Exhibition is also organized in collaboration with National Book Trust, New Delhi so as to make the latest publications available to the staff as well as the students. A massive renovation project for the library was undertaken with a magnanimous grant by an alumnus of the institution, Dr. Ram Swarup Gupta (IA & AS).

Cafeteria

A spacious and well-furnished cafeteria, housed in a state-of-the-art building and, situated amidst lush green lawns, has been provided for the convenience of the staff and the students. The eatables served here are nutritious, fresh and at subsidized rates. It has a sitting room exclusively for staff members. The first floor of the cafeteria has a sitting area exclusively for girls. Besides, Water- filters and Coolers have been installed in many parts of the college for providing clean drinking water.



Common Room

The college has spacious and well-furnished separate Common Rooms for Girls as well as for Boys, which are well- equipped with modern facilities like LED TVs, TT Table etc. These provide for many indoor and board games for Girls as well as for Boys.

Post-Graduate Library and Book Bank

A Post Graduate Library has been set up to cater exclusively to the needs of the Post Graduate students and teachers. There are around 12,000 books in the library. New books are constantly added to this valuable collection. Apart from this, books are provided to the needy and deserving students for the entire session.

Multi-purpose Sports Complex, Indoor and Outdoor Gymnasium

The college boasts of Multi-purpose Sports Complex where sports persons practise. It also serves as the venue for Principal Rala Ram Memorial Annual Athletic Meet. A new Gymnasium was built recently with all ultra- modern equipment for the benefit of students, staff and the society in general. In the previous session, an open Gym was also set-up near the college canteen, eliciting enthusiastic response amongst the students. Players are given priority and fee-concessions at the time of admission but at the same time they are expected to be regular in attendance and disciplined in behaviour. Further, they are not allowed to get registered with any club outside the college without the prior permission of the college or to play against the college.



National Cadet Corps (NCC)

The college offers opportunities for training under the NCC. An NCC Orientation Programme is organized in the beginning of each session to introduce the students to the benefits of joining NCC and also regarding the opportunities available to them to join the armed forces through NCC. Every year a large number of our students enrol themselves and manage to clear 'B' and 'C' certificate exams. Our cadets routinely win laurels at Inter-Group Camps, Pre- *Thal Sena* Camp and Army Training Camp. During the last session, NCC Cadets participated enthusiastically in various social and humanitarian activities like Blood Donation, Tree Plantation; *Swachh Bharat Abhiyan* etc.



National Service Scheme (NSS)

Students can opt for the National Service Scheme (NSS) at the time of admission to the institution. Fully realising Institution Social Responsibility, NSS unit of the college organizes lectures on topics as are socially relevant besides organizing Cleanliness Drives, Blood Donation Camps, National Voters' Day, No Smoking Day and Camps in Rural Areas. This enables the students to realize the dignity of labour and emerge as socially responsible citizens. Last year NSS volunteers celebrated National Youth Day and organized a Seminar against drug abuse. 25 students completed 100-hour internship under *Swachh Bharat* Programme. Seven -day Camp was organized during winter break.



Cultural Activities

The college is known for the all-round development of the students' personality through participation in various cultural activities so that they may be employed gainfully in their leisure hours. With this end in view Talent Search Competition is organized in the beginning of every session. Students are encouraged to participate in Intra-college and Inter-college competitions and develop their latent capabilities. Conducting Quiz Contests, Debates, Inter-college Cultural Competitions and Youth Festivals are an annual feature with the college. Every year our talented students win a large number of Individual as well as Group Prizes. The College Team created history during the session 2023 by winning 25 First Prizes, 15 Second Prizes and 13 Third Prizes, bagging First Runners- Up Trophy with a haul of 53 prizes in Panjab University Zonal Youth & Heritage Festival

Seminars and Extension Lectures

The college makes an endeavor to sensitize students to issues of contemporary relevance by organizing extension Lectures, Seminars etc. This makes it possible for them to interact with peers in their respective fields. Further, they are encouraged to develop confidence and overcome stage-fear by participation in In-class Seminars organized by their subject teachers. Post- Covid, Webinars are organised by all the departments in order to keep the students and teachers abreast of the latest developments in their respective subjects.

Research Journals

Three Journals publishing Research Articles / Papers are brought out by the college. **Consonance** - for English, **Insight** for Pure Sciences and **Assimilation** - for Social Sciences have been launched with a view to encourage research temper amongst teachers. These journals receive a warm response from researchers from India and abroad.



College Magazine Arya Kumar

The college brings out one issue of college magazine *Arya Kumar* every year. It comprises of Sanskrit, Hindi, Punjabi, English, Fine Arts, Planning Forum, Science, Computer and News Sections. It is compiled and published by an Editorial Board comprising of staff and student editors. The magazine provides an opportunity to the budding writers to showcase their respective talent and also provides them with a forum to express their views on issues relevant to them.

Transport Facility

D.A.V. College is situated on Chandigarh-Hoshiarpur road and as such, it is easily accessible from the bus stand. However, the college has its own bus which facilitates commuting of students from the outskirts of the city and also from the local bus-stand. The college plans to purchase more buses in near future for the benefit of students commuting from nearby rural areas.

Clubs and Societies

A vast network of clubs and societies exists in the college which makes learning an interesting and interactive process. These include subject societies as Tagore Literary Society, Hindi Sahitya Sabha, Punjabi Sahit Sabha, Kalidas Society, Mendeleev Society, C.V. Raman Physics Society, Chanakya Forum, Planning Forum, Sargam Society, Sundar Pichai Society and Ramanujan Mathematical Society, Kala Manch, Fashionistas. These clubs and subject societies plan lectures, movie-shows, outings and excursions besides paper-reading contests and seminars to break the monotony of classroom teaching and bring about a refreshing change.

Hostels

The college has separate Hostel facilities for Girls and Boys. The Hostels are provided with modern amenities like TVs, Visitors' Rooms and Dining Hall etc. Day and night medical services are provided to the hostel inmates. Every student wishing to join the hostel must fill a separate hostel form for this purpose at the time of admission. For detailed hostel rules, kindly refer to the hostel form.

Guest Rooms

Two well-furnished and airy rooms serve as Guest Rooms for dignitaries from Panjab University, D.P.I. or U.G.C. or any other guest of the college staff or management.

IGNOU Study Centre

A Study Centre for Indira Gandhi National Open University is functional in the college. The Study Centre (2216) has been coaching students for 38 courses and has 56 Counsellors. It holds counselling sessions for two hours in the evening on weekdays and also on Sunday mornings. The centre provides opportunities to those who have discontinued their studies to undertake a course of their choice once again besides providing a chance to the others to upgrade their qualifications.



OUR INFRASTRUCTURE



DAV Collegiate Senior Secondary School

Established in 2004, and affiliated to Punjab School Education Board, DAV Collegiate Senior Secondary School provides instruction in Humanities, Commerce, Medical and Non-Medical Streams. All facilities available to college students are also provided to the students of Collegiate School. The School shows excellent results every year and, as a result thereof, students succeed in getting admission in reputed institutions every year. A new state of the art building, Principal Major Rajkumar Memorial Block has been built in the campus to house the Collegiate School.

About the Teaching Departments

Department of English

Department of English offers an Elective course at the level of Graduation besides a compulsory course. Through the curriculum, the faculty tries to inculcate an interest in language and literature. The department boasts of a Language lab that is used by Hindi and Punjabi departments as well. *Tagore Literary Society* organizes Gaiety - a cultural Fest, Debates, Quiz contests, Paper-reading contests and screening of movie shows on regular basis. Further the faculty trains the students with the aim of improving communication and inter-personal skills of the students and guiding them to face interviews in a better manner. For this purpose two workshops were organised by the department of English in the previous session.

Department of Hindi

Teaching students at the graduation level, department of Hindi attempts at improving communication skills of the students, while at the same time creating an interest in classic and modern literature. Students are also trained for participation in creative writing items during the Youth Festival. *Hindi Sahitya Sabha* organizes extension lectures to keep the students aware of latest literary trends. Inter-college declamation contests, paper-reading contests, poster-making contests, *Hindi Diwas* Celebration and the like are also organized by the Sabha. A cultural extravaganza to celebrate Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsava was staged during the previous session.

Department of Punjabi

Post Graduate department of Punjabi imparts teaching to students at graduation level in both-compulsory and elective streams besides running the Post Graduate course. It trains students to understand and appreciate the nuances of language and literature in a better way. Many students, on passing out from the department, pursue Research work and qualify UGC- NET. *Punjabi Sahit Sabha* encourages students to participate actively in competitions like debates, Paper Reading Contests and creative writing competitions. During the session, International Mother Language Day is celebrated and an Essay Writing Competition was organized.



Department of Sanskrit

Sanskrit is taught as an elective subject at the graduation level. Students are trained in the intricacies of language and introduced to literary masterpieces as well. They are also taken to the Indological Centre at V.V.R.I. Sadhu Ashram for visits to the museum. A webinar on Stress Management was organised besides the Celebration of *Sanskrit Saptah*.



Post-Graduate Department of Commerce & Business Management

Housed in a newly constructed, spacious and ICT-enabled block, the department of Commerce and Business Management offers M.Com., B.Com. and B.B.A. Courses. The department trains students for placement in reputed companies by making them prepare Business Reports and Projects on various topics. For the benefit of students, companies are invited to the college for conducting interviews and providing placement. Besides, an Induction Programme is organized in the beginning of the session. Motivational lectures and Power-Point Presentation Competitions are organized. During 2022-23, a two-day workshop on Financial Literacy was organised.



Department of Economics

Offering a course at the level of Graduation, the department of Economics guides the students to be rational and analytical in their approach while at the same time making them aware of the various economic problems faced by the country. It also helps them to be conscious of economic issues concerning the world and develop an inquisitive attitude. The department organized two International Webinars and Power-Point Presentation Competition for the benefit of students and teachers.



Post-Graduate Department of History

M.A. (History) was introduced in the college following persistent demand of the students. Besides, History is offered to students of B.A. as an elective subject. The department attempts to make the students realize the rich cultural heritage of India as well as that of the world. Significant events of World History are discussed so as to prepare the students for competitive exams and also for participation in quiz contests. Educational trips and Excursions are organized to Fatehgarh Sahib Gurudwara, Amritsar, Ranjit Bagh Archeological Museum and Indus Valley Site at Ropar. A Webinar was organized on life and ideology of shaheed Bhagat Singh.



Post-Graduate Department of Political Science

The Department runs both Under Graduate as well as Post-Graduate course in Political Science. Students are sensitized to issues of contemporary relevance through classroom discussions, Seminars and extension lectures by renowned scholars and specialists in their respective fields. Besides organising an ICSSR-Sponsored National Seminar on Drug Abuse, the department celebrated Constitution Day, Human Rights' Day & Voters' Day



Department of Biology and Agriculture

Department of Biology offers an elective course at B.Sc. level. Spacious laboratories fitted with the latest Instruments, Herbarium, Insect Cabinets, Inoculation Chamber, Autoclave and Projectors are some of the unique features of the department. Students are given theoretical as well as practical training in latest developments in Agriculture, Horticulture and Floriculture. During each session Guest lectures are organized. Apart from this, Plantation Drive is organized in which medicinal and aromatic plants of different varieties were planted. Our students from B.Sc. outshine those from other institutions and show brilliant results every year in University examination. During 2022-23, students were taken on an educational trip to Kukanet forest to study the flora and fauna of the area.



Department of Mathematics

Department of Mathematics offers an elective course in Arts besides a compulsory course in Science (Non-Medical) and Computer Applications

degree at the graduation level. Besides the prescribed curriculum, students are encouraged to participate in Mental Aptitude tests and Quiz Contests through the aegis of Ramanujan Mathematical Society. Last year the society organized an online quiz contest.



Department of Physics

Physics is taught at B.Sc. level. The department is well-equipped to meet the needs of the students. CV Raman Physics Society involves students in multifarious activities like Science Day Celebration, Quiz Contests, Paper Reading Contests etc. In 2022-23, Slogan Writing Competition was organised to mark the birth anniversary of Dr. CV Raman. Inter- college Poster Making and Essay Writing Competitions are regularly organized, besides the celebration of National Science Day in collaboration with Chemistry, Mathematics and Biology departments. Renovation of Physics Lecture Theatre is being taken up for the benefit of students.



Department of Chemistry

Department of Chemistry imparts training to students of B.Sc. Medical as well as Non-Medical. The department has excellent infrastructure in the



form of three modern laboratories that are equipped with pH Meter, Calorimeters, Distilled Water Units, Heating Plates, Electric Shakers, Vacuum Pumps, Ovens, Potentiometers, and Electric Weighing Machines etc. The department prepared sanitizer during

Covid-19 for use in the institution. Mendelev Society celebrated Earth Day, World Water Day and Mole Day in 2022-23.

Department of Computer Science

Ultra- modern Media and IT Block is a step towards promoting IT and Media Vision amongst students. The Department of Computer Science and Applications runs many professional courses like B.C.A, P.G.D.C.A. and the much coveted M.Sc. (IT). Sophisticated air- conditioned rooms with four Computer Labs and a Multimedia Room, Seminars on a regular basis and visits to Industrial Houses, High-Speed Connectivity are some of the unique features of the department. The highly qualified, young and dynamic faculty keeps the students abreast of the latest trends in the field. Many of our Alumni are placed well in reputed companies like Infosys, IBM, Mahindra Finance to name a few. Technofest – Computer Fest is organized annually, wherein students from several schools participate in Technical Rangoli, Power Point Presentation, Computer Quiz and Best out of e-Waste. Lectures on Career Counselling are organised for students of Computer Science department. Besides, the department organises short – term computer literacy courses for staff as well as students on regular basis.



Department of Sociology

Sociology is taught as an elective subject at undergraduate level. Teaching students to understand society in a disciplined way, it also sensitises them to basic social processes and patterns of social behaviour, thereby training them to interpret the role of social institutions and social interactions. The department undertakes significant events every year such as Self – defense Training Camp for girls, gender sensitisation programmes with special focus on Online Banking Frauds, visits to old age home and to the slum areas for guiding children about the



importance of hygiene and that of education.



Department of Physical Education

A popular choice among students, Physical Education teaches them basic Physiology, importance of exercise, nuances of various sports besides engaging them into practice sessions and preparing them for Inter-college sporting events. Every year our sports-men bring laurels to the institution. In 2022-23, the highlight was winning the Runners-Up Trophy in Panjab University Inter-College Swimming Championship with 12 medals and 2nd Runners-Up Trophy in Panjab University Inter-College Kayaking and Canoeing Championship winning as many as 53 medals. A camp on Self- Defense, of one- week duration was organized. A friendly Cricket match between Teaching and Non- teaching Staff was the highlight of the session.



Department of Music

Music department imparts training to students at the graduation level in both Vocal and Instrumental streams. Students are trained not only from the examination point of view; rather they are prepared in such a manner as to be able to participate in competitions besides being able to give stage performances. Further Sargam Society arranges interactive sessions with renowned artists so that the students may benefit from their experiences. Basantotsava was celebrated by the society.

Degree Courses

To get graduation degree in the chosen discipline (Arts / Commerce / Science / B.C.A. / B.Sc. Agriculture), candidates are required to qualify the paper of Environmental Education.

Note: A student may be allowed to change a subject in the even semester, but he/she will have to clear the subject as deficient in lower semester exam.

B.A.

Eligibility :

A candidate who has passed one of the following examination with English as one of the subjects shall be eligible to join the 1st Semester of B.A.(Hons.) degree course of this University, however, a person who has not qualified English as one of the subjects at the +2 examination, shall be eligible to join B.A. (Hons.) 1st Semester provisionally subject to his/her qualifying the deficient subject of English from the parent Board/Body/Council/University in two consecutive chances subsequent to his/her admission, failing which his/her admission to B.A. (Hons.) 1st Semester and the result for the examination shall automatically stand cancelled.

1. (i) B.A./B.A. (Hons.) Part I (Old Scheme)/Pre-Medical/Pre-Engg. Intermediate Arts/Science/Agri culture examination of Panjab University;
 - (ii) the +2 examination under 10+2+3 system of education of a recognized University/Board/ Council;
 - (iii) *Prak/Shastri/Vishard* examination with Compulsory English;
 - (iv) any other examination recognized by the University as equivalent to (i), (ii) or (iii) above.
- A candidate who has been placed under compartment in the +2 examination conducted by:

Board/Body/Council/University in India shall be eligible to seek admission to the First Semester of B.A. (Hons.) Course, provided he/she fulfills the following conditions:-

- (i) He/she should have been placed in compartment in one subject only;
 - (ii) He/she should have obtained at least 20% marks in the subject in which he/she been placed in compartment; and (in) He/she should have obtained the requisite percentage of marks in the aggregate examination as laid down in the relevant regulations.
- Provided that a candidate joining the B.A.(Hons.) First semester should have obtained at least 35% marks in the aggregate of all the subjects including the marks obtained by him/her in the subject of compartment (Theory & Practicals taken together)

Subjects Offered

The college offers a wide variety of subject combinations that students can opt for. They are advised to choose subjects carefully since they will be studying the same subjects throughout the duration of their course. Subjects offered include: English, Hindi, Punjabi, Sanskrit, History, Political Science, Economics, Sociology, Mathematics, Physical Education, Music(Vocal), Music (Instrumental), Computer Science, Fine Arts and Home Science



B.Sc. Medical/Non-Medical/Computer Applications

Eligibility:

A student who has passed the following examination (i) with pass in English as one of the subjects shall be eligible to join in the I Semester of B.Sc. (Honours) degree course in a College affiliated to Panjab University. However, a person who has not qualified English as one of the subjects at the +2 examination, shall be eligible to join B.Sc. (Hons.)1st Semester provisionally, subject to his/her qualifying the deficient subject of English from the parent Examination held in July/August, subsequent to his/her admission, failing which his/her admission to B.Sc. I Semester and the result for the examination shall automatically stand cancelled. The basic requirement for admission to B.Sc. (Hons.) 1 year programme is as follows:-
The +2 examination of a recognised Board/Body/Council; Or any other examination recognised by the University as equivalent.

Provided that:-

- (i) a person joining the B.Sc. (Hons.) course must have obtained at least 35 per cent marks in the aggregate of the qualifying examination and has studied Science subjects as per Annexure
- 1.(i) The details of teaching hours, marks and credits allocated to each course (Theory and Practicals) are given in respective Syllabi.
- (ii) A candidate who has been placed under compartment in the +2 examination conducted by a Board/Body/Council/University in India in one subject only, obtaining at least 20% marks in the subject of compartment (Theory and Practical taken together) shall also be eligible to seek admission to 1st year of B.Sc. (General

Course) provided he/she has obtained 40% marks in the aggregate of all subjects including the marks obtained by him/her in the subject of compartment. (Theory and Practical taken together).

Subjects Offered

English, Punjabi, Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Mathematics and Computer Science

Students are advised to choose subjects carefully since they will be studying the same subjects throughout the duration of their course.

B.Com.

Eligibility:

(A) Admission to the first year of B.Com. (General) degree course shall be open to a person who has passed one of the following examinations conducted by a recognized Board/Council/University.

- (B) Subject to the reservations made by the University, admission to B.Com.-I shall be made strictly on merit. The merit of the candidate shall be computed as:
- (i) Percentage of marks in the qualifying examination
 - (ii) Add score of 2 for each of the subjects passed from the subject referred in A (a) not exceeding a score of 8 in total.
- (C) A candidate who has been placed under compartment in the +2 examination conducted by a Board/Bodies/Councils/ University in India shall be eligible to seek admission to the First Year of B.Com. (Hons.) Course, provided the candidate fulfills the following conditions:-
- (i) should have been placed in compartment in one subject only;
 - (ii) should have obtained at least 20% marks in the subject in which the candidate had been placed in compartment; and

B.B.A.

Eligibility: Admission to the first year of BBA-I (Honours) Degree course shall be open to a person who has passed 10+2 examination in any stream with at least 50% marks in aggregate. Other eligibility conditions are the same as that for other UG Courses.

Computer Science Group

B.C.A.

Eligibility:

A student who has passed the following examination (i) with pass in English as one of the subjects shall be eligible to join in the 1st Semester of B.C.A. (Honours) degree course in a College affiliated to Panjab University. However, a person who has not qualified English as one of the subjects at the +2 examination, shall be eligible to join B.C.A. (Hons.) 1st Semester provisionally subject to his/her qualifying the deficient subject of English from the parent Board/Body /Council/ University in one consecutive chance in the Supplementary Examination held in July/August, subsequent to his/her admission, failing which his/her admission to B.C.A. (Hons.) 1st Semester and the result for the examination shall automatically stand cancelled. The basic requirement for admission to B.C.A. (Hons.) 1st year programme is as follows:-
The +2 examination of a recognized University/Board/ Council; OR any other examination recognized by the University as equivalent.

A candidate who has been placed under compartment in the +2 examination conducted by a Board/Body/Council/University in India shall be eligible to seek admission to the First Semester of BCA (Hons.)/BCA (Honours with Research) course provided he fulfils the following conditions:

- (i) He/She should have been placed in compartment in one subject only;
- (ii) He/she should have obtained at least 20% marks in the subject in which he had been placed in compartment; and

- (iii) He/she should have obtained the requisite percentage of marks in aggregate of the examination (subjects) as laid down in the relevant regulations.

Note:

Students of B.A. /B.B.A./ B.C.A./ B.Com. / B.Sc. (Medical/Non-Medical) II and III, who have not qualified Environmental Education and Introduction to Computer Science Module-I paper as yet, are required to qualify the said papers.

M. Com.

Eligibility:

1. A person who has passed B.Com. shall be eligible to join Part-I of M. Com. (First Semester)
2. Any examination of another University recognized by Panjab University, Chandigarh as equivalent to any of the above examination.

M.Sc. (IT)

Eligibility:

- A person who has passed one of the following examinations shall be eligible to join Part-I of M.Sc. (IT) (First Semester):-
- (a) B.C.A. examination from the Panjab University.
 - (b) B.E./B. Tech. in Computer Science/Information Technology from the Panjab University.
 - (c) B.C.A./B. Sc. (Hons.) in Computer Science/B.Sc. (H.S.) in Mathematics & Computing or any other graduation with Computer Science/ Information Technology/ Computer Applications and Mathematics in all three years of graduation.
 - (d) B. Voc. (Software Development), B.Voc. (Hardware and Networking) & B. Voc. Multimedia (Graphics & Animation) course.

- (e) Any examination of another University recognized by Panjab University, Chandigarh as equivalent to any of the above examination.

M.A. I (Political Science, History, Punjabi)

Eligibility:

M.A. (Political Science)

A person who has passed one of the following examinations from the Panjab University or an examination recognized by the Syndicate as equivalent thereto, shall be eligible to join the M.A degree course, other than in Physical Education:-

- (i) A Bachelor's degree obtaining at least 45% marks in the subject of Postgraduate course, or 50% marks in the aggregate.
- (ii) B.A with Honours in the subject of the Postgraduate course or B.Hons. School course.
- (iii) A Master's Degree exam in any other subject A person who has passed B.A. with 45% marks in any Social Science Discipline shall also be eligible.

M.A. (History)

Eligibility:

- (i) B.A. with Honours in the subject of History.
- (ii) A Bachelor's degree in any Faculty with 50 per cent marks in the aggregate.
- (iii) B.A.(Pass)/ B.Sc.(Pass) examination in full subjects obtaining at least 45% marks in the subject of History.
- (iv) A Master's Degree exam in any other subject

M.A. (Punjabi)

Eligibility:

Bachelor's degree obtaining at least 45% marks in the subject of Graduate course or 50% marks in the aggregate B.A./B.Sc./B.Sc. (Hons.) or Master's degree examination in any other subject provided that he/she has studied Punjabi compulsory at graduate level.

Weightage:

1. 15% weightage will be given to the student those who studied Punjabi as an elective subject at graduate level.
2. 15% weightage will be given to the student who studied B.A. (Hons.) in Punjabi at under graduate level.
3. The 15% weightage will be given to those who passed B.A. (Hons.) School in Punjabi at under graduate level.
4. Those who passed elective Punjabi and Hons. (both) will be given 20%.
5. Any exemption will be given to SC/ST candidates as per UGC norms.

Post Graduate Diploma in Computer Applications (PGDCA), Fashion Designing (PGDFD)

Eligibility for PGDCA:

- (a) Bachelor's degree of Panjab University under 10+2+3 system of Examination with at least 50% marks in any discipline.
- (b) B.E./B.Tech
- (c) B. Voc. (Software Development) B.Voc.(Hardware and Networking) and B.Voc. Multimedia (Graphics& Animation) course with at least 50% marks.
- (d) Any other examination recognized by the Syndicate as equivalent to (a), (b) or (c) above.

Information Regarding Compartment Candidates of Other Universities:

- A student of any other University who is placed in compartment in 1st & 2nd , 3rd & 4th Semester of B.A./B.Sc./ B.Com./BCA/BBA Course be not allowed to join the 3rd and 5th Semester Course of this University.
- Compartment Candidates of +2 Examination seeking admission to first degree level running parallel utility-oriented certificate/Diploma/ Advanced Diploma and Add-on Courses/ Programme along

- with B.A./B.Sc./B.Com./BCA/ BBA Part-I Course. With a view to vocationalize the education at first-degree level during X plan period, parallel utility-oriented certificate/Diploma/ Advanced Diploma Programs have been introduced. The candidates who are placed in compartment in +2 examination having been admitted provisionally to B.A./ B. Sc./B.Com. Part-I Class shall also be considered to have been admitted provisionally in these courses. The eligibility requirements and Regulations/Rules for certificate/Diploma/Advanced Diploma Courses sanctioned by the U.G.C. under Career Or Orientation Programme to various affiliated Colleges from the admissions of 2004 as Add-On Courses for B.A./B.Sc./ B.Com. (Semester System) (1st, 2nd and 3rd will be same as for admission to B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. Course (Semester System).

Note:

For admission, fraction of marks less than the requisite percentage would not be rounded off to the advantage of the candidate, i.e. 32.9%, 39.9% and 49.9% shall not be rounded off to 33%, 40% and 50% etc.

Mid-Term Admission

Admission of candidates from other Universities with deficient subjects, if any:

- a) A candidate who has passed his/her previous semester examination of B.A. /B.B.A./ B.C.A. / B.Sc. / B.Com. Course conducted by another University / College affiliated to another University in India

under specific authorization by the University concerned, be allowed to migrate to the college affiliated to this University in the next semester of the respective course on the condition that such a candidate will have to clear the deficient subjects/if any, within the permissible chances, as permissible under the regulations.

- (b) A student of any other University who is placed under compartment in the previous semester of B.A. /B.B.A./ B.C.A./ B.Sc. / B.Com. Course is not allowed to join next semester class of this University.

- (a) The reservation of seats shall be governed by the Regulation 29.1 and 29.2 given at Page 169 in P.U. Cal. Volume-I, 2022 and any intimation sent by DR (Colleges) and D.P.I. (Colleges). However, it is clarified that the concession is not available in the case of candidates who are seeking admission to the next higher class on basis of having earned compartment in+2 Examination i.e. neither in the subject of compartment nor in the aggregate.
- (b) As per Circular No. Misc./A-1/32031-32231 dated 06/04/2022, it has been decided as under:
 - Two additional seats for **One Girl Child** out of Two Girl Children per unit per course subject to maximum limit of four.
 - An additional seat each for the **Cancer/AIDS/Thalessemia**

patient for admission to a given course in Panjab University and its affiliated colleges provided he/she is otherwise eligible.

- III. Two seats for candidates from **Rural Area** - 10th and 10+2 from Rural Area and one for those from Border Area.

General Information & Rules of Conduct for the Students

Fee Concession/Student Aid

1. The application for fee concession should be made on a printed form available from the College Office.
2. The applicants, if necessary, may be interviewed by a Staff Committee appointed by the Principal.
3. Concessions, stipends and scholarships of all categories are liable to be withdrawn if a student deteriorates in studies, remains irregular in attendance, or is found guilty of misbehaviour.
4. In case a scholar enjoying any concession migrates or leaves the College before appearing in the Semester Examination, he/she will be required to surrender the entire amount paid to him/her by way of concession or stipend with retrospective effect

Attendance

1. The students on roll of the college are expected to be regular in attendance. The Principal is fully authorized to drop a student from the rolls of the College if he/she is habitually irregular in attendance. Further, the students are required to be punctual in attending every period and the late-comers will not be marked present, although they may be permitted to enter the class by the teacher concerned at his/her discretion.

2. According to University rules, students of I, II and III year Degree are required to attend at least 75% of lectures delivered in each subject and practicals where applicable. If a student's shortage is beyond the limit stated above, he/she will be detained. The names of such students as remain absent without leave from their classes for 5 consecutive days will be struck off the rolls of the college.
3. 2% Weightage is given to students' attendance in their final result. Students are, therefore, advised to be regular in their attendance.
4. The condonation of shortage in attendance by the Principal, in accordance with University rules, will be considered in respect of those students only whose reports about studies and conduct are satisfactory.
5. The student who wishes to withdraw from the college must do so on a prescribed form and his/her application should be countersigned by his/her father or guardian. Such applications should be presented after the college dues have been cleared up-to-date.
6. If a student, whose name is struck off the rolls of the college after his/her admission form for the University Examination has been sent up for non-payment of dues or any other reason, his/her admission form will be withdrawn by the Principal and no notice to this effect will be given to the student or his/her guardian.
7. The names of all such students as fail to clear their dues may be removed or struck off the rolls of the college. No concession in this regard will be given to players or top-scholars.
8. The name of a student is liable to be removed or struck off the rolls of the college, if
 - (i) He/she remains absent from the college without leave for 5 consecutive days.
 - (ii) He/she fails to clear the dues in time.
 - (iii) He/she withdraws from the college.
9. The student whose name is removed from the rolls of the college on account of any reason is advised to seek Re-admission at the earliest. Otherwise he/she is likely to fall short of lectures.
10. The shortage in attendance may be condoned by the Principal exceptionally in respect of those students whose report about their studies and conduct are satisfactory. Condonation of shortage cannot be claimed as a matter of right.
11. It is desired from the students that they should neither stand in the passage nor roam in the verandas during their vacant period. They should sit either in the Common Room or avail the Library facility.
12. Misuse of furniture, fans, electricity and writing on walls/benches is totally prohibited. Exemplary punishment will be meted out to the defaulters.
13. Any student found indulging in ragging will be awarded exemplary punishment which may include expulsion from the College. An online undertaking must be submitted by all students in this regard.

Mid-Semester Test

1. In order to assess the progress of the students, the college conducts two Mid-Semester Tests (MSTs) during the academic session. It is mandatory for each student to appear in both the MSTs with a valid college I-Card. The dates for the MSTs are announced as per directions from the competent authority

2. Students are required to take all tests and they must obtain 20% marks in each subject and 25% in aggregate in order to become eligible for appearing in the University Examination.
3. A total of 5% weightage is carried by Mid Semester Test which is added to the final result of the student. Students are, therefore, advised to take the Mid Semester Test seriously. 3% weightage is given to Assignments / Seminars / Projects and 2% on the basis of Attendance. All these add to 10% weightage in the final result of the students.
4. Leave from Mid Semester Test on account of illness or any other equally urgent reason must be secured personally from the Principal well in time.
5. Absence from the examination for whatever reason means nil result.

Merit Scholarship

Merit Scholarships are available for those students who are placed in the Merit List.

Identity Card

All students must get their Identity Card at the time of admission. Every student is required to keep their Identity Card with him/her while in the College. If a student is found without it on any occasion; he/she will be fined.

Rules for Payment of Dues

1. Every candidate will have to make the full payment of dues at the time of admission, i.e., on the same day the form is signed by the Principal. No part payment of the dues will be ordinarily accepted.
2. Cheques and Bank Drafts will not be accepted for the payment of College or hostel dues.
3. Fees once paid shall not be refundable.
4. In case of change of subjects from Science Group to Arts Group, Science fee already paid will not be refunded.
5. If a student leaves the college during any of the terms of session, he/she will have to pay the fee for the whole period of that term except in case of migration.
6. Extension in date for the payment of dues may be granted by the Principal in exceptional cases and application for the same must be made on prescribed form available from the college office.
7. Names of the defaulters will be struck off the College rolls on the 10th day of the following month as penalty and in the meantime

- the late payment fine of Rs. 5/- per day will be charged up to the last day of the month and Rs. 10/- per day thereafter up to the day of re-admission.
8. When the name of a student is struck off on account of non-payment of dues, this may be in the form of penalty, the name actually continues in the rolls for other purposes and it can be removed only if the guardian of the student makes written application for the same. The lectures, if attended during this period, will not be counted.
 9. If a student is absent or is on leave from the College, he/she must arrange to pay his/her fee on due date.
 10. If a student does not get his/her name removed from the rolls of the college by giving an application to the Principal, he/she will be treated as on rolls of the college for the purpose of realization of dues even for the period of absence.
 11. Students who do not pay their dues will not be permitted to appear in Mid- Semester Test.
 12. Scheduled Caste/Backward Class students are required to submit certificate of caste and income on the prescribed form duly attested by an M.P. or M.L.A. or a Gazetted Officer along with the admission form, otherwise no concession will be allowed.
 13. All fee concessions to SC/ST students would be given as per Punjab Govt. / Panjab University rules.

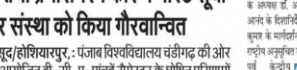
