





DAV College, Hoshiarpur is celebrating 100 years of Excellence in Imparting Holistic Education. It has, over the decades, carved a niche for itself in the fields of Academics, Sports and Extra Curricular activities. As per Surveys conducted by prestigious magazines as India Today, The Week, Outlook and Education World for College Rankings all over India, D. A. V. College, Hoshiarpur has been ranked routinely among the top -100 colleges of the country for the past several years now. Established in 1926, the college is affiliated to Panjab University, Chandigarh, It imparts education in the following courses - B.A., B.B.A., B.C.A., B. Com., B. Com. (Hons.), B.Sc. (Medical, Non-Medical and Computer Science), M.Com., M.Sc. (IT), M.A. (Punjabi, Political Science and History) besides Post Graduate Diploma in Computer Application and Post Graduate Diploma in Fashion Designing. Apart from these, B. Sc. (Data Analytics) and B. Sc. (Medical Lab Technology) are likely to be initiated this year. Many skill development courses affiliated to Jagat Guru Nanak Dev Punjab State Open University, Patiala have been initiated.13 Value-Added Job- Oriented Courses were run free of cost in the session 2024-25. Competitive Exam Cell guides students by providing coaching to students as are desirous of appearing in Competitive exams. Four One -Month Bridge Courses were conducted for school students. DAV College, Hoshiarpur has signed an MoU with Teaching-Learning Centre, Ramanujan College, University of Delhi for conducting Faculty Development Programs and Short Term Courses.

The excellent infrastructure- Hem Raj Kapoor Auditorium, Principal Major Raj Kumar Memorial Block, Audio- Visual Lab, ICT-enabled Commerce Block, Principal S.P. Salik Memorial Block, Principal Ramdas Hall, commodious classrooms, Lecture Theatres, well- equipped Laboratories, and well-stocked Library, Playgrounds, Gymnasium, Students' Centre, Fine Arts' Studio, Home Science Lab, Post Graduate Block, Post Graduate Library, Computer Labs, Botanical Garden, Heritage Room and a branch of Indian Bank – all provide an atmosphere that is both healthy and conducive to learning. College website www.davchsp.org.in is updated on regular basis and all information regarding teaching departments,

academic calendar, infrastructure and courses is available online.

Initially set up as a High School in 1898, D.A.V. College was licked into shape by great men like late Lala Ram Parshad, Lala Devi Chand, Lala Ram Dass and Pandit Rala Ram in 1926. In response to persistent public demand, it was raised to a Degree College in 1940 and Post- graduate classes were added to the institution in 1948. Infrastructure & Facilities

Administrative Block

A fully computerized administrative Block comprising of Principal's Office, General Office and Accounts Office is housed in an imposing building. The block has been renovated recently and has ultramodern facilities. Close Circuit Television has also been installed in all parts of the college building. The office ensures smooth functioning and proper interaction with Panjab University, Chandigarh and office of the DHE, Punjab for receiving grants, students' registration and examination etc.

Principal Major Raj Kumar Memorial Block

A newly constructed block housing classrooms and office of D.A.V. Collegiate Senior Secondary School was named as Principal Major Raj Kumar Memorial Block to commemorate a former Principal of the college. This block, having modern amenities, has fifteen classrooms, an Audio-Visual Room and a mini Auditorium.

Sh. Hemraj Kapoor Memorial Auditorium

Sh. Hemraj Kapoor Memorial Auditorium with a seating capacity of about five hundred people hosts Seminars, Extension Lectures, Quiz- Contests and Inter-College Competitions besides organizing Talent Search Competition. Sound-proofing of the Auditorium was undertaken to improve acoustic effects.

Principal S.P. Salik Memorial Arts' Block

Principal S.P. Salik Memorial Arts' Block, houses the offices of UGC-NRC Cell, Internal Quality Assurance Cell, Departments of Fashion Designing, Fine Arts and Music.

Principal Ram Dass Hall

Named after the founder Principal of the college, Principal Ram Dass Multi- purpose Hall has been built to keep up with the determination to provide better facilities to the students. This Hall is used for various activities during the course of the session.

Lab for Communicative English

A new state-of-the-art Audio-Visual Lab for Communicative English has been set up. This enables teachers as well as students to make use of latest in ICT for making learning interactive. The lab, fully air-conditioned, is equipped with interactive board & sound system. English Learning Software is used for teaching the nuances of English language. This has been set up in accordance with skill-development initiative in order to provide better opportunities for honing communicative skills.

Placement Cell

A proactive Placement Cell functions in the college with a view to provide Placement opportunities to students. Orientation sessions were organized wherein students were introduced to the process of placement and how to go about it. MoUs were signed with two organizations for training students and assisting them in the process of placement. Seminars were arranged to initiate students into the placement opportunities available in Armed forces. To instil confidence in the students, Training and Placement Cell of the college, in collaboration with Punjab Skill Development Mission organized a session on Gaining In- demand Skills. In collaboration with Skill Labs, they also organized a Webinar on the Role of Experiential Learning in Enhancing Employability, and another on New Age Skills and Job Market. 10 students across different courses were placed in ICICI Bank and WD, Hoshiarpur in Campus Placements Drives organized by the institution.




Library and Reading Room

The college provides excellent library and reading room facilities to the students. There are around 49,000 valuable books in the college library. Besides, over 40 Indian and Foreign Magazines, Journals and Newspapers are subscribed to. The college library is fully computerized. The college is a member of N-list programme of UGC through which members can have an access to thousands of books and journals online. The library subscribes to INFLIBNET and DELNET programmes. Students as well as teachers have access to a large number of e-books and journals. Kindles have been added to the rich collection of books. Library Orientation Programme is an integral part of education in the college, whereby students are familiarized with the functioning of the library. Book Exhibition is also organized in collaboration with National Book Trust. New Delhi so as to make the latest publications available to the staff as well as the students. A massive renovation project for the library was undertaken with a magnanimous grant by an alumnus of the institution, Dr. Ram Swarup Gupta (IA & AS). New books are added periodically to meet the needs of the students and the titles of the new books are displayed on the Notice Board.

Post-Graduate Library and Book Bank

A Post Graduate Library has been set up to cater exclusively to the needs of the Post Graduate students and teachers. There are around 12,000 books in the library. New books are constantly added to this valuable collection. Apart from this, books are provided to the needy and deserving students for the entire session.

Cafeteria

A spacious and well-furnished cafeteria, housed in a state-of-the-art building amidst lush green lawns, has been provided for the convenience of the staff and the students. The eatables served here are nutritious, fresh and at subsidized rates. It has a sitting room exclusively for staff members. The first floor of the cafeteria has a sitting area exclusively for girls. Besides, Water- filters and Coolers have been installed in many parts of the college for providing clean drinking water.

Common Room

The college has spacious and well-furnished separate Common Rooms for Girls as well as for Boys, which are well- equipped with modern facilities like LED TVs, TT Table etc. These provide for many indoor and board games for Girls as well as for Boys.




Multi-Purpose Sports Complex, Indoor and Outdoor Gymnasium

The college boasts of Multi-Purpose Sports Complex where sports persons practise. It also serves as the venue for Principal Rala Ram Memorial Annual Athletic Meet. A new Gymnasium was built recently with all ultra- modern equipment for the benefit of students, staff and the society in general. In the previous session, an open Gym was also set-up near the college canteen, eliciting enthusiastic response amongst the students. Players are given priority and fee-concessions at the time of admission but at the same time they are expected to be regular in attendance and disciplined in behaviour. However, they are not allowed to get registered with any club outside the college without the prior permission of the college or to play against the college.

National Cadet Corps (NCC)

The college offers opportunities for training under the NCC. An NCC Orientation Programme is organized in the beginning of each session to introduce the students to the benefits of joining NCC and also regarding the opportunities available to them to join the armed forces through NCC. Every year a large number of our students enrol themselves and manage to clear 'B' and 'C' certificate exams. Our cadets routinely win laurels at Inter- Group Camps, Pre- Thal Sena Camp and Army Training Camp. During the last session, NCC Cadets participated enthusiastically in various social and humanitarian activities like Blood Donation, Tree Plantation; Swachh Bharat Abhiyan etc. College NCC. unit has 55 Cadets who undertook several activities during the session. College NCC Cadet Ankit Singh was selected for Youth Exchange Programme organized in Bhutan. NCC Cadets were inspired by Colonel Lovedeep Singh, CO 12th Punjab Batallion, NCC. 7 outstanding Cadets were conferred upon with ranks.

Students can opt for the National Service Scheme (NSS) at the time of admission to the institution. Fully realising Institution Social Responsibility, NSS unit of the college participates in several activities including Cleanliness Drives in and outside the campus. A Seven –day Camp was conducted in the college.

Besides, Environmental Education Programme was organized under the guidelines of Punjab State Council for Science and Technology, wherein Poster-Making Competition was held. Ms. Gazalpreet Kaur, IPS, addressed the students to create awareness against drugs. Celebration of National Voters' Day, National Youth day Celebration, Poster – making Contest on Awareness Regarding Traffic Rules were some other activities of NSS Unit.



Cultural Activities

The college is known for the all-round development of the students' personality through participation in various cultural activities so that they may be employed gainfully in their leisure hours. Re-affirming its undisputed position as a peer among Cultural activities during the session 2024-25,in Panjab University Zonal Youth and Heritage Festival, DAV College, Hoshiarpur emerged as First Runners Up with 15 First Prizes, 10 Second and 20 Third Prizes. 65th Panjab University Inter- Zonal Youth and Heritage Festival was hosted successfully by the institution. Students are encouraged to participate in Intra-college and Inter-college competitions and develop their latent capabilities. Conducting Quiz Contests, Debates, Inter-college Cultural Competitions and Youth Festivals is a regular feature with the college.

Seminars and Extension Lectures

The college makes an endeavour to sensitize students to issues of contemporary relevance by organizing extension Lectures, Seminars etc. This makes it possible for them to interact with peers in their respective fields. Further, they are encouraged to develop confidence and overcome stage-fear by participation in In-class Seminars organized by their subject teachers. Post- Covid, Webinars are organized by all the departments in order to keep the students and teachers abreast of the latest developments in their respective subjects.

Research Journals

Three Journals publishing Research Articles / Papers are brought out by the college. Consonance - for English, Insight for Pure Sciences and Assimilation - for Social Sciences have been launched with a view to encourage research temper amongst teachers. These journals receive a warm response from researchers from India and abroad

College Magazine Arya Kumar

The college brings out one issue of college magazine Arya Kumar every year. It comprises of Sanskrit, Hindi, Punjabi, English, Fine Arts, Music, Home Science, Planning Forum, Science, Computer and News Sections. It is compiled and published by an Editorial Board comprising of staff and student editors. The magazine provides an opportunity to the budding writers to show their talent and also provides them with a forum to express their views on issues relevant to them..

Transport Facility

D.A.V. College is situated on Chandigarh-Hoshiarpur road and as such, it is easily accessible from the bus stand. However, the college has its own buses which facilitate commuting of students from the outskirts of the city and also from the local bus-stand. The college plans to purchase more buses in near future for the benefit of students commuting from nearby rural areas.

Clubs and Societies

A vast network of clubs and societies exists in the college which makes learning an interesting and interactive process. These include subject societies as Tagore Literary Society, *Hindi Sahitya Sabha, Punjabi Sahit Sabha*, Mendeleev Society, C.V. Raman Physics Society, *Chanakya* Forum, Planning Forum, *Sargam* Society, Sundar Pichai Society and Ramanujan Mathematical Society, *Kala Manch*, Fashionistas. These clubs and subject societies plan lectures, movie-shows, outings and excursions besides paper-reading contests and seminars to break the monotony of classroom teaching and bring about a refreshing change.



Hostels

The college has separate Hostel facilities for Girls and Boys. The Hostels are provided with modern amenities like TVs, Visitors' Rooms and Dining Hall etc. Day and night medical services are provided to the hostel inmates. Every student wishing to join the hostel must fill a separate hostel form for this purpose at the time of admission. For detailed hostel rules, kindly refer to the hostel form.

Guest Rooms

Two well- furnished and airy rooms serve as Guest Rooms for dignitaries from Panjab University, DPI or UGC or any other guest of the college staff or management.

IGNOU Study Centre

A Study Centre for Indira Gandhi National Open University is functional in the college. The Study Centre (2216) has been coaching students for 38 courses and has 56 Counsellors. It holds counselling sessions for two hours in the evening on weekdays and also on Sunday mornings. The centre provides opportunities to those who have discontinued their studies to undertake a course of their choice once again besides providing a chance to the others to upgrade their qualifications.

DAV Collegiate Senior Secondary School

Established in 2004, and affiliated to Punjab School Education Board, DAV Collegiate Senior Secondary School provides instruction in Humanities, Commerce, Medical and Non-Medical Streams. All facilities available to college students are also provided to the students of Collegiate School. The School shows excellent results every year and, as a result thereof, students succeed in getting admission in reputed institutions every year. A new state of the art building, Principal Major Rajkumar Memorial Block has been built in the campus to house the Collegiate School.

About the Teaching Departments

Department of English

Department of English offers an Elective course at the level of Graduation besides a compulsory course. Through the curriculum, the faculty tries to inculcate an interest in language and literature. The Tagore Literary Society organizes Gaiety - a cultural Fest, Debates, Quiz contests, Paper- reading contests and screening of movie shows on regular basis. Further the faculty trains the students with the aim of improving communication and inter-personal skills of the students and guiding them to face interviews in a better manner. For this purpose workshops are organised by the department routinely. A Poem Recitation & Speech competition was organised during the session.

Department of Hindi

Teaching students at the graduation level, department of Hindi attempts at improving communication skills of the students, while at the same time creating an interest in classic and modern literature. Students are also trained for participation in creative writing items during the Youth Festival. Hindi Sahitya Sabha organizes extension lectures to keep the students aware of latest literary trends. Intercollege declamation contests, paper- reading contests, poster- making contests, Hindi Diwas Celebration and the like are also organized by the Sabha. As a Skillenhancement initiative, the nuances of Hindi typing were explained to the students and thereafter a competition on Hindi Typing was organized on Hindi Diwas.

Department of Punjabi

Post Graduate department of Punjabi imparts teaching to students at graduation level in both-compulsory and elective streams besides running the Post - Graduate course. It trains students to understand and appreciate the nuances of language and literature in a better way. Many students, on passing out from the department, pursue Research work and qualify UGC- NET. Punjabi Sahit Sabha encourages students to participate actively in competitions like debates, Paper Reading Contests and creative writing competitions. During the session, PG Department of Punjabi organized International Conference on Moral Values. The Department also celebrated International Mother Tongue Day.

Department of Sanskrit

Sanskrit is taught as an elective subject at the graduation level. Students are trained in the intricacies of language and introduced to literary masterpieces as well. They are also taken to the Indological Centre at V.V.R.I. Sadhu Ashram for visits to the museum. Activities on Stress Management are organised besides the Celebration of Sanskrit Saptah.



Post-Graduate Department of Commerce & Business Management

Housed in a newly constructed, spacious and ICT- enabled block, the department of Commerce and Business Management offers MCom, B Com and BBA Courses. The department trains students for placement in reputed companies by making them prepare Business Reports and Projects on various topics. For the benefit of students, companies are invited to the college for conducting interviews and providing placement. Besides, an Induction Programme is organized in the beginning of the session. Motivational lectures and Power- Point Presentation Competitions are organized. During 2024-25, College Development Council - Sponsored Seminar on Corporate Social Responsibility and Sustainable Development was organized by the department. They also organized a Seminar on Understanding Risk- Reward Relationship in Stock Market.

Department of Economics

Offering a course at the level of Graduation, the department of Economics guides the students to be

rational and analytical in their approach while at the same time making them aware of the various economic problems faced by the country. It also helps them to be conscious of economic issues concerning the world and develop an inquisitive attitude.

Post-Graduate Department of History

MA (History) was introduced in the college following persistent demand of the students. Besides, History is offered to students of BA as an elective subject. The department attempts to make the students realize the rich cultural heritage of India as well as that of the world. Significant events of World History are discussed so as to prepare the students for competitive exams and also for participation in quiz contests. Educational trips and Excursions are organized to places of historical importance - Fatehgarh Sahib Gurudwara, Amritsar, Ranjit Bagh Archeological Museum and Indus Valley Site at Ropar.

Post-Graduate Department of Political Science

The Department runs both Under Graduate as well as Post-Graduate course in Political Science. Students are sensitized to issues of contemporary relevance through classroom discussions, Seminars and extension lectures by renowned scholars and specialists in their respective fields. Besides organising ICSSR-Sponsored National Seminars, the department celebrates Constitution Day, Human Rights' Day & Voters' Day. PG Department of Political Science observed International Day of Peace.

Department of Biology

Department of Biology offers an elective course at BSc level. Spacious laboratories fitted with the latest instruments, Herbarium, Insect Cabinets, Inoculation Chamber, Autoclave and Projectors are some of the unique features of the department. During each session Guest lectures are organized. Apart from this, Plantation Drive is organized in which medicinal and aromatic plants of different varieties were planted. Students are taken on educational trips to Kukanet forest to study the flora and fauna of the area. World Suicide Prevention Day was observed by the Department of Biology by organizing Poster-Making, Debate and Group Discussion on the topic.

Department of Mathematics

Department of Mathematics offers an elective course in Arts besides a compulsory course in Science (Non-Medical) and Computer Applications degree at the graduation level. Besides the prescribed curriculum, students are encouraged to participate in Mental Aptitude Tests and Quiz Contests through the aegis of Ramanujan Mathematical Society. National Science Day was celebrated with great fervour.

Department of Physics

Physics is taught at B Sc level. The department is well-equipped to meet the needs of the students. Information Regarding Compartment Candidates

- Those students who have compartment in +2 class with less than 20% marks be also allowed to be admitted provided they have obtained 20% or above marks in the supplementary examination up to the last date for admission. They would be considered for admission to the next higher class provided; they are eligible and subject to availability of seats.
- 2. A student whose result of +2 examination conducted by a School Board is published late may be admitted without late fee within 15 working days of the declaration of the result and his / her attendance shall be counted from the date of admission. Mid-Term Admission

Admission of candidates from other Universities with deficient subjects, if any:

- (a) A candidate who has passed his/her previous semester examination of B.A. General/B.B.A./ B.C.A. / B.Sc. / B.Com. Course conducted by another University / College affiliated to another University in India under specific authorization by the University concerned, be allowed to migrate to the college affiliated to this University in the next semester of the respective course on the condition that such a candidate will have to clear the deficient subjects/if any, within the permissible chances, as permissible under the regulations.
- (b) A student of any other University who is placed under compartment in the previous semester of B.A. /B.B.A./ B.C.A./ B.Sc. / B.Com. Course is not allowed to join next semester class of this University.

Reservation

General 55.5%, Physically Handicapped 3%, SC 15%, BC 5%, ST 7.5%, Sports 5%, Children / Grand Children of Freedom Fighters 2%, Son / Daughter / Wife of Military Personnel 5%, Terrorist Victim 2%.

NCC Certificate-holders for admission to various courses in the college shall be given weightage as under: A - 1% B - 2% C - 3%

- (a) The reservation of seats shall be governed by the Regulation 29.1 and 29.2 given at Page 168 in P.U. Cal. Volume–I, 2007 and any intimation sent by D.P.I. (Colleges). However, it is clarified that the concession is not available in the case of candidates who are seeking admission to the next higher class on basis of compartment in+2 Examination.
- (b) As per circular No. Misc./A-1/32031-32231 dated 06.04.22, it has been decided as under:
- Two additional seats for One Girl Childper unit per course subject to a maximum limit of four.
- II. An additional seat for the Cancer/ AIDS/ Thalessemia patient for admission to a given course in Panjab University and its affiliated colleges provided he/she is otherwise eligible.
- III. Reservation up to academic year 2022-2023 only to those wards of martyrs/ permanently disabled (up to 80% leading to incapacitation) of Kargil War who have a valid certificate from the Ministry of Defence to this effect and the same be entered in the Pension Book of the Family.
- IV. 1% seats with minimum of 1 seat in the Departments and affiliated Colleges except in partially financed / self-financing course.

A maximum weightage in marks of 4% for distinction in any or all the co-curricular activities shall be maintained.

General Information & Rules of Conduct for the Students Fee Concession/Student Aid

- The application for fee concession should be made on a printed form available at College Office.
- The applicants would be interviewed by a Staff Committee appointed by the Principal.
- Concessions, stipends and scholarships of all categories are liable to be withdrawn if a student deteriorates in studies, remains irregular in attendance, or is found guilty of misbehaviour.
- 4. In case a scholar enjoying any concession migrates or leaves the College before appearing in the Semester Examination, they will be required to surrender the entire amount paid to them by way of concession or stipend with retrospective effect.

Attendance

- The students on roll of the college are expected to be regular in attendance. The Principal is fully authorized to drop a student from the rolls of the College if they are habitually irregular in attendance. Further, the students are required to be punctual in attending every period and the late-comers will not be marked present, although they may be permitted to enter the class by the teacher concerned at their discretion.
- According to University rules, students of I, II and III
 year Degree are required to attend at least 75% of
 lectures delivered in each subject and practicals where
 applicable. If a student's shortage is beyond the limit
 stated above, they will be detained.
- 3. 2% Weightage is given to students' attendance in their final result. Students are, therefore, advised to be regular in their attendance.
- The condonation of shortage in attendance by the Principal, in accordance with University rules, will be considered in respect of those students only whose reports about studies and conduct are satisfactory.
- 5. The student who wishes to withdraw from the college must do so on a prescribed form and their application should be countersigned by their parent. Such applications should be presented after the college dues have been cleared.
- 6. If a student, whose name is struck off the rolls of the college after their admission form for the University Examination has been sent up for non-payment of dues or any other reason, their admission form will be withdrawn by the Principal and no notice to this effect will be given to the student or their guardian.
- The names of all such students as fail to clear their dues may be removed or struck off the rolls of the college. No concession in this regard will be given to players or top-scholars.
- 8. The name of a student is liable to be removed or struck off the rolls of the college, if they

- (i) remain absent from the college without leave for 5 consecutive days.
- (ii) fail to clear the dues in time.
- (iii) withdraw from the college.
- A student whose name is removed from the rolls of the college (due to any reason) is advised to seek Readmission at the earliest. Otherwise there is likelihood of shortage of lectures.
- 10. Shortage in attendance may be condoned by the Principal exceptionally in respect of those students whose report about their studies and conduct is satisfactory. Condonation of shortage cannot be claimed as a matter of right.
- 11. It is desired that the students should neither stand in the passage nor roam in the verandas during their vacant period. They should sit either in the Common Room or avail themselves of Library facility.
- 12. Misuse of furniture, fans, electricity and writing on walls/benches is strictly prohibited. Exemplary punishment will be meted out to the defaulters.
- 13. Any student found indulging in ragging will be awarded exemplary punishment which may include expulsion from the College. An online undertaking must be submitted by all students in this regard.

Mid-Semester Test

- In order to assess the progress of the students, Mid-Semester Test would be held in the months of October and March.
- 2. Students are required to take all tests and they must obtain 20% marks in each subject and 25% in aggregate in order to become eligible for appearing in the University Examination.
- A total of 5% weightage is carried by Mid Semester Test, and is added to the final result of the student. Students are, therefore, advised to take the Mid Semester Test seriously.
- 4. 3% weightage is given to Assignments / Seminars / Projects and 2% on the basis of Attendance. All these add to 10% weightage in the final result of the students.
- 5. It is compulsory to appear in the Mid Semester Test.
 Absentees would be fined according to rules.
- Leave from Mid Semester Test on account of illness or any other urgent reason must be secured personally from the Principal well in time.
- 7. Absence from the examination for whatever reason means nil result.
- Any student found guilty of using unfair means during the examination will be administered deterrent punishment which may even mean expulsion from the College.

Identity Card

All students must get their Identity Card at the time of admission. Every student is required to keep their

Identity Card with them while in the College. If a student is found without it on any occasion; they would be fined.

Rules for Payment of Dues

Note: Fee would be charged as per Panjab University and Punjab Government Guidelines

- 1. Fee would be charged Semester wise.
- Migration fee would be charged extra wherever required.
- Every candidate will have to make the full payment of dues at the time of admission, i.e., on the same day the form is signed by the Principal. No part payment of the dues will be accepted.
- 4. Cheques and Bank Drafts will not be accepted for the payment of College or hostel dues.
- 5. Fees once paid would not be refunded.
- In case of change of subjects from Science Group to Arts Group, Science fee already paid would not be refunded.
- If a student leaves the college during any of the terms of session, they would have to pay the fee for the whole period of that term except in case of migration.
- 8. Extension in date for the payment of dues may be granted by the Principal in exceptional cases.
- 9. Names of the defaulters will be struck off the College rolls on the 10th day of the following month as penalty and in the meantime the late payment fine of Rs. 5/per day will be charged up to the last day of the month and Rs. 10/- per day there after up to the day of readmission.
- 10. When the name of a student is struck off on account of non-payment of dues, this may be in the form of penalty. However, the name continues in the rolls for other purposes and can be removed only if the guardian of the student submits a written application for the same. Lectures, if attended during this period, will not be counted.
- 11. If a student is absent or is on leave from the College, they must arrange to pay their fee on due date.
- 12. If a student does not get their name removed from the rolls of the college by giving an application to the Principal, they would be treated to be on rolls of the college for the purpose of realization of dues even for the period of absence.
- 13. Students who do not pay their dues will not be permitted to appear in Mid Semester Test.
- 14. Scheduled Caste/Backward Class students are required to submit certificate of caste and income on the prescribed form duly attested by an M.P. or M.L.A. or a Gazetted Officer along with the admission form, otherwise no concession will be allowed.
- 15. All fee concessions to SC/ST students would be given as per Punjab Govt. / Panjab University rules.
